A Letter from Our President & Founder and Our CEO

Dear friends,

In 2023, your unwavering prayers and support empowered us to navigate global uncertainties and economic challenges, allowing us to extend our impact.

Throughout the year, your generosity sent 61,732 new wheelchairs to people living with disabilities in 33 developing countries; since our founding in 2001, you have helped distribute a total of 1,365,696 wheelchairs in 95 countries.* These gifts have transcended individual lives, reaching caregivers, families, neighbors, and friends, fostering positive change within entire communities.

June marked a significant milestone as the first shipment of wheelchairs from our second manufacturer, Krypton Industries, reached Costa Rica. The strategic decision to produce our wheelchairs at two factories ensures a constant supply of new wheelchairs for years to come.

Teams from Free Wheelchair Mission continued to strengthen our global network through visits to overseas distribution partners. These visits included comprehensive training sessions, manufacturing assessments, and vision trips, all aimed at fortifying our network and expanding our reach.

Increased media coverage, spanning television news segments, magazine articles, social media posts, and digital advertising, has significantly heightened our visibility both nationally and internationally. This enhanced exposure helped us to reach all new groups of supporters.

Together with you, we have achieved so much, but the need for mobility remains urgent: the World Health Organization estimates that 80 million people worldwide need wheelchairs. With your enduring partnership, we can remain committed to addressing this need and mobilizing others with the life-transforming gift of mobility. Thank you for blessing our mission and for being part of this journey with us.

Who We Are

Free Wheelchair Mission is the world's largest nonprofit manufacturer of cost-efficient, durable wheelchairs designed for the developing world.

Since 2001, we have distributed 1.4 million wheelchairs to individuals living with disabilities in 95 countries, providing renewed dignity, independence, and hope through the gift of mobility.

What We Do

We design and manufacture wheelchairs that are shipped by ocean container to our worldwide network of distribution partners, whom we also train in wheelchair provision, assembly, maintenance, and use.

By collaborating with like-minded partners across the globe, we provide mobility to people living with disabilities in under-resourced countries—all at no cost to the recipient.

Whenever possible, our partners help us let wheelchair recipients know that they are loved by God and are receiving their new wheelchair because of Him.



The Need

The World Health Organization estimates that 80 million people in the world need a wheelchair. Without mobility, people living with disabilities in developing countries are often left confined to their beds or homes, hindering opportunities to pursue an education, make a living, or participate in community. A new wheelchair would offer them countless new possibilities.

Evert's Story

Evert is a young husband and father in Managua, Nicaragua. He lost mobility in a devastating accident while selling milk and whey out of his horse-drawn cart. An out-of-control truck struck him, dragging him several yards and causing severe injuries that led to the amputation of both legs.

Determined to remain mobile, and with no mobility aids available to him, Evert resorted to a makeshift solution: he would place two plastic milk containers on the ground, one after the other, and crawl over them to move about. Evert did this for three years.

That all changed when Evert received a new wheelchair from our local distribution partner, Metanoia Missions. Now, Evert can continue selling milk from his cart, mounting his wheelchair in the back.

“The wheelchair has restored my independence, health, and ability to continue providing for my family,” grinned Evert.

The new wheelchair has also granted him the freedom to go places more easily on his own—something that once seemed impossible after his life-altering accident.

Manufacturing

In June 2023, a milestone was achieved as the inaugural shipment of wheelchairs from our second manufacturing partner, Krypton Industries Limited, reached Costa Rica. Headquartered in Kolkata, India, Krypton was selected by Free Wheelchair Mission for their industry expertise and proven ability to adhere to stringent quality standards while maintaining affordable production costs. Krypton will produce over 12,000 units of our GEN_2 and GEN_3 wheelchair models annually.

Following the initial container to Costa Rica, Krypton shipped wheelchairs to our distribution partners in the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Eswatini, Guatemala, India, Nepal, Nicaragua, Peru, and Sri Lanka. This strategic expansion of manufacturing capabilities through the establishment of a second factory not only ensures a reliable and uninterrupted wheelchair supply chain, but also lays the groundwork for potential future expansions in our wheelchair distribution initiatives.

This collaborative effort has been the cornerstone of our success, allowing us to transform lives in some of the most remote regions on earth.

The wheelchair program has become one of our most important programs. Thanks to the work you allow us to do, we are a reference in the Dominican Republic for all people or institutions that need wheelchairs. We have touched the lives of thousands of people with disabilities, many of whom are now able to work.

Hoa's Story

Hoa, a 23-year-old in Vietnam, has faced the challenges of living with polio since birth. With limited mobility, she has had to crawl or be carried, and her daily activities, including personal hygiene, require constant assistance from her parents. The extent of care she needed has significantly impacted the family's already-limited resources, resulting in diminished assets and reduced income.

However, a ray of hope beamed into Hoa's life when she received a new wheelchair from our local distribution partner, Giving It Back To Kids. With the newfound mobility provided by the wheelchair, Hoa can now explore the world more freely, and her parents can witness her enjoying life beyond the confines of their home.

“This is a precious gift that will be with her for the future,” said Hoa’s mother. “Hoa will no longer have to crawl like she used to. She can go farther now.”

The gift of a wheelchair has not only enhanced Hoa's independence but also alleviated the burden on her parents, symbolizing a positive change in their family's journey.

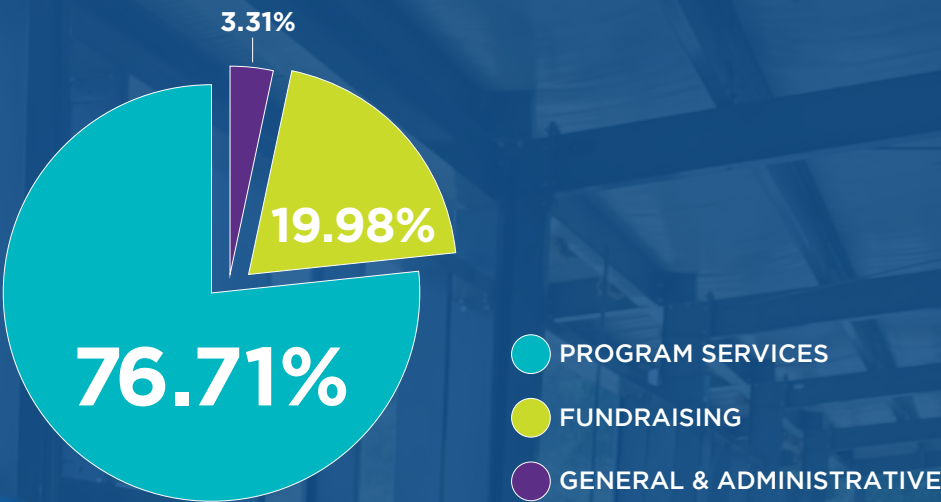
In 2023, we continued to strive for excellence by maintaining a 76% program ratio as we distributed 61,732 wheelchairs in 33 countries.

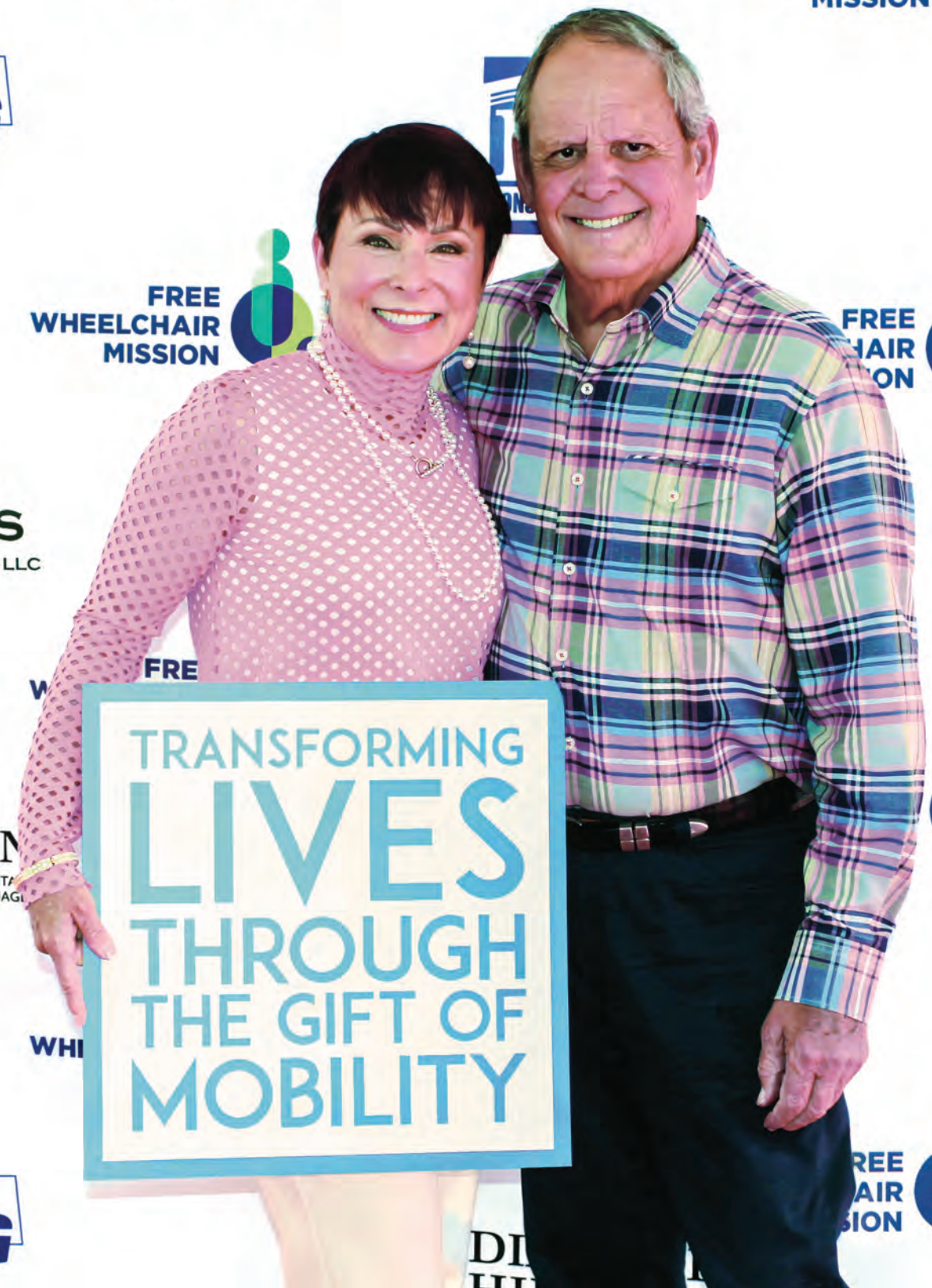
